Holy Communion... This Holy Mystery

This week we continue our discussion of Holy Communion. Last time we said that communion is thanksgiving; it is remembrance; and it is a type of sacrifice.

Holy Communion is a means of receiving God's grace through the action of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:8), whose work is described in John 14:26: "But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you." We call upon the Holy Spirit in the Great Thanksgiving: "Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine." We ask God to "make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world..." (UMH; page 10)

The idea of grace and the means of grace are vital to our Wesleyan theology. The Bible and our tradition teach us to believe we are sinners, constantly in need of divine grace. We believe that God is gracious and loving, always making available the grace we need. Grace is God's love toward us, God's free and undeserved gift. The grace of God is made available to us through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ and works in our lives through the presence and power of the Holy Spirit.

While divine grace reaches us any time and in any way that God chooses, God has designated certain means or channels through which grace is most surely and immediately available. John Wesley said: "By 'means of grace' I understand outward signs, words, or actions, ordained of God, and appointed for this end, to be the ordinary channels whereby he might convey to men [and women], preventing, justifying, or

sanctifying grace" ("The Means of Grace," II.1). In the General Rules, Wesley listed these means of grace as, "The public worship of God; the ministry of the Word, either read or expounded; the Supper of the Lord; family and private prayer; searching the Scriptures; fasting or abstinence" (Book of Discipline, ¶ 103; page 74). These means are not to be understood as ways of earning salvation; they are, rather, ways to receive, live in, and grow in divine grace. The Wesleyan tradition has continued to emphasize the practice of these means of grace throughout our salvation process. If for no other reason, this alone makes receiving Holy Communion as often as possible a desirable thing to do.

Holy Communion also has to do with the end of history, the outcome of God's purpose for the world — "Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again". We commune not only with the faithful who are physically present but with the saints of the past who join us in the sacrament. To participate is to receive a foretaste of the future, a pledge of heaven "until Christ comes in final victory and we feast at his heavenly banquet". Christ himself looked forward to this occasion and promised the disciples, "I will never again drink of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom" (Matthew 26:29; Mark 14:25; Luke 22:18). When we eat and drink at the Table, we become partakers of the divine nature in this life and for life eternal (John 6:47-58; Revelation 3:20). We are anticipating the heavenly banquet celebrating God's victory over sin, evil, and death (Matthew 22:1-14; Revelation 19:9; 21:1-7). In the midst of the personal and systemic brokenness in which we live, we yearn for everlasting fellowship with Christ and ultimate fulfillment of the divine plan. Nourished by sacramental grace, we strive to be formed into the image of Christ and to be made instruments for transformation in the world.

The recent cancellation of services due to weather suggests that we need to remind ourselves of how this information is disseminated. Thankfully,

we rarely have the need to cancel worship services for bad weather. However, when we do we want you to hear about it before you make the drive to church. Notice of closing or postponements will be posted in the following ways:

- Message on the church telephone answering service;
- Notices sent to TV Channels 2, 8, and 23 (Channel 6 does not report church closings;
- Notices posted on our website, Facebook, and Twitter accounts;
- Message sent through our prayer chain;
- Word-of-mouth...When you hear about a closing, please contact people you know to be sure they also get the message; let's look out for each other.

The decision to close is never an easy one to make and is often made in advance so that we can get the message out. This may mean that we choose to close and later find out it was not necessary. It is still better to be safe than sorry. Our location is sometimes challenging to access and we do not want anyone to get hurt trying to cross icy streets from our parking areas. The offices may close due to inclement weather. This is for the safety of people coming into the office during the week. However, if you need to contact us you should call to see if someone may have come in or you can leave a message; we try to check messages regularly. You may also send email and we can retrieve those from home. Many of you also have our cell phone numbers to use in case of emergency. We want everyone to be safe this winter and we hope you understand we are doing our best to meet everyone's needs. If you ever have any doubt about whether to venture out in bad weather, please err on the side of caution and do not put yourself at risk. We want you here – IF you can get here safely. Otherwise, we prefer that you are safe.

This week someone suggested we pass the offering plate twice at our next service. We probably won't do that, but we do want to remind you that ministry continues no matter the weather and your tithes and offerings are needed to keep ministry going. Please make up what is missed on a snow day at your next opportunity. Thank you and be blessed!





Lay Servant Ministries

"Your life may be the only Bible some people ever read."

"As lay servants care, lead, and communicate,

they encourage, equip, and support others for deeper commitment to Christ and to faithful discipleship."

The United Methodist Church has always focused on the ministries of the laity and encouraged "the priesthood of all believers" (1 Peter 2:5-9). One of the ways we empower lay persons to be in ministry is through a program called Lay Servant Ministries. This program is designed to encourage and train those persons who have heard a call to servant ministry involving leadership, pastoral care, or communication. Classes are offered each year to help each Lay Servant learn more about what God is calling them to do and to give them tools to help with their ministry. Lay Servants may lead small group studies, hold leadership positions in the church, or make hospital and home visitations. Their roles are only limited by their desire to serve Jesus and the needs of their home church. Currently, our church has voted to approve two Lay Servants for ministry within our congregation.

Don Cole has been a member of our church family since March of 2010. His spiritual journey has included online Bible study courses, participation in the Pastor's Bible Study group, and serving on the 2012 adult mission team. Don has successfully completed the Basic Lay Servant training class and several courses offered as part of Seminary Light at Oklahoma City University. He has served as a volunteer with our youth program and traveled with the youth to summer camp. Don has now been


asked to serve in the role of class facilitator for the Harmony Class beginning in January 2014. Don was approved for service by our Annual Charge Conference for 2013 and again for 2014.

Amy Miller has been a member of our church family since June of 1995. Amy has served in many leadership roles for our church over the years. She is currently in her second year as Lay Leader, which essentially means that she has some role to play in nearly every aspect of church life. She serves on most leadership committees within the church and she serves as a link between the congregation and all other church leaders, including the pastor. To The Youth Volunteers:


