From Dennis the Minis-ter:

This Sunday we celebrate the work of the **United Methodist Women** in our morning worship. The UMW is the largest denominational faith organization for women with approximately 800,000 members whose mission is fostering spiritual growth, developing leaders and advocating for justice. Members raise up to \$20 million each year for programs and projects related to women, children and youth in the United States and in more than 100 countries around the world. Our SSUMC unit is 92 members strong and raise thousands of dollars for missions, locally and globally.

In our worship Sunday, we are going to highlight one of their longstanding mission projects: **Neighborhood Services Organization** in Oklahoma City. NSO Director, Stacey Ninness will deliver the morning message. NSO seeks to serve the needs of inner city children, youth and families. A recent report had this update on the work of NSO:

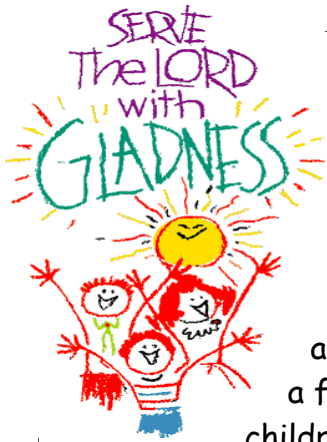
"While Neighborhood Services Organization (NSO) of Oklahoma City was birthed in the Methodist church, it is not an exclusively United Methodist agency. Its forerunner was the Bethlehem Center/Wesley Community House, serving the central part of the city. Some of the newest programs include Martha's House, a transitional housing program for homeless families; Gatewood House, a short-term residential program for young, single, homeless, expectant mothers; Douglas House, a transitional housing program for homeless men ages 18-24; and Palo Duro, a 22-unit apartment complex for individuals who are homeless and mentally disabled. We are doing together what none of us could do separately."

Another news article told how NSO stepped-in to help a teen named David:

"David said he was hungry after he was arrested for raiding a snack machine inside an Oklahoma City school, according to recent news media reports. A United Methodist-supported agency reached out to help the homeless teen."

After David spent two weeks in jail, law enforcement officials moved to drop the charges against him and to find a place for him to stay upon his release. Neighborhood Services Organization (NSO) met the need. Stacey Ninness, NSO director, told how the agency responded. "Just after the broadcast on the news about David, case manager Tracy Long called me and said, 'I want David; he needs the Carolyn Williams Center,'" Ninness said. The NSO center assists homeless men ages 18-24. The dormitory-style facility can house up to 14 men."

Please come and worship with us. As we lift up Christian mission and what God is doing through Neighborhood Services Organization and our own United Methodist Women's unit. See you, Sunday.

Read 1 Corinthians 13

1 Corinthians 13: 4a

"Love is..."

1 John 3: 16



"This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters."

With Valentines Day happening this week, and "**Love**" being the focus of the Nation this Monday, I thought it might be perfect timing for us to re-evaluate what "**Love**" is, so that our hearts and lives might reflect it daily for not just our spouses or boyfriends, but the whole world. The point that I want to focus on comes from our verse above, "This is how we know what "**Love**" is: **Jesus Christ "Loved"** by laying down His life for us." **Love is an action!** In this verse the Apostle John is expressing the significance that Christ Jesus "**Loved**" by laying down His life for us, so that, "And we ought to "**Love**" by laying down our lives for our brothers and sisters." So if "**Love**" is an action, and not just a word, how am I supposed to act out love? Well the Apostle Paul outlined a simple outline to follow, one that is not all inclusive, but is very helpful for us to express the depths of our hearts to the ones that we "**Love**".

“Love isPatient, Kind, Rejoices in Truth, Never gives up, Never loses Faith, Always Hopes, Never Fails”

“Love is not, Envious, Boastful, Arrogant, Rude, Selfish, Irritable, Resentful, Rejoicing in Wrong”

So we know **“Love”** is an action, and we have some actions that we can express **“Love”**, time to evaluate which ones am I able to do easily and which ones are really hard for me, because **“Love”** is not just Patient or Kind, but it is also Selfless, and not Arrogant. Most of the times its easy to do some of these but less frequently is it possible to do them all. The list does not say just be have hope, or just don't be resentful, but do them all! Don't just check them off the list either, “I was patient with them on Monday already...”

Jesus didn't do that for us but He laid down His Life! Lay down yours for those that you love, and those that you have a hard time loving and see the miracles that God performs through it! Father God thank you for **“Loving”** us and laying down your life for us so that we might know how to lay down our lives for others, help us to take the words of Paul and evaluate the areas that we can deepen our **“Love”** for others whether that be in “Patience” or in “Hope” help us Lord to **“Love”** in an action and not just in words.
