*"Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with*

*mourning; rend your hearts and not your clothing. Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishment."* (Joel 2:12-13)

On Wednesday, February 22 at 6:30 PM we will officially begin our observance of the Season of Lent. I hope that you will join us for our Ash Wednesday worship service that evening.

The observance of Lent is a tradition of the church that dates back over a thousand years and represents our observance of the forty days leading up to the passion, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus. It is a time when we are reminded of the great mercy, love, and forgiveness shown to us by God through the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. It is a time when we seek ways to restore our relationship with God and with one another. It is a time when we recognize our need for the renewal of our faith.

This year the theme of our Lenten journey is: ***"Journey to Hope."*** We will examine our relationships, our struggles, our challenges, our disappointments, our gifts, our opportunities, and our blessings. We will seek the One who leads us on this journey toward the door that opens onto the only real hope for the world in which we live. We will walk this path together and help one another along a road where pot holes

are common and detours are tempting.

Lent is about becoming closer to God and becoming better representatives of God in the world. It isn't about giving up chocolates or soda pop for six weeks. Instead of giving something up for Lent, I have advocated for the past several years that we "take something up" for Lent and turn it into a habit. For example: start a new bible study program, volunteer for a new ministry team, get involved in something at church you are not already doing. If you take up something new for God and keep doing it for six weeks it may become a habit that you won't want to stop once the season is over. I believe this is how we can make Lent into a transformative experience instead of just a dusty old church tradition. If we truly are a Resurrection people then something new and exciting ought to be happening in us and through us by the time Easter Sunday arrives in April.

The mood and the colors of Lent can be distressing for some; there is an inherent darkness surrounding this time of reflection, repentance, and challenge. Many people want to jump ahead and rush to Easter so they can celebrate our Risen Lord. While understand this desire for joy, I am reminded that we cannot get to the Resurrection without first going through the Cross. Suffering and sadness precede the joy; it's part of the deal. We must remember the sacrifice so that we can celebrate the triumph. Please join me on this difficult journey to Calvary and beyond.


She shares insights from the writings of Thomas Merton, Daniel Barrigan, Ghandi and Bob Dylan.


