"To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven." (Ecclesiastes 3:1)

Christianity takes time seriously. God is revealed to us through actual events that happen both in historical time and in the present time. God is made known alongside historical and political events. "In the days of Herod king of Judea" (Luke 1:5); or "it took place when Quirinius was governor of Syria" (Luke 2:2). God's time is our time, too, marked by a temporal order called a calendar.

The place and value of time in the lives of Christians is reflected in Christian worship. Like the rest of our lives, worship is structured based on recurring rhythms of the day, the week, and the year. Time is basic to the structure of our lives as Christians. Our present time becomes an encounter with God's actions in time, both past and future. How we arrange our time of worship enables us to commemorate and reexperience the events upon which our salvation is grounded. Christian worship is built on a foundation of time.

The way we use time each day is a good indicator of what is truly important to us. We can always find time for those things that matter the

most to us. How we spend our time reflects our real priorities. How we allocate this limited resource reveals what we value most.

The church also shows what is most important in the life of the church by the way we keep and allocate time. The Liturgical Calendar or The Church Year reflects our priorities of faith and practice. Since the earliest days of the church, there has been a sense of *kairos*, the right or proper time present, in which God has brought a new dimension to reality. *"The time has come; the kingdom of God is upon you"* (Mark 1:15).

In the New Testament we see the beginning of a tendency to look back, to recall the time past in which things had happened. Remembering the past comes to be almost as important as anticipating the future before the first century ends. Commemorating the events of history and faith that shaped the community has always been an important part of preparing Christians for the future glory of God.

Over the next few newsletters I want to spend some time talking about how the Liturgical Calendar developed over time and why we practice worship according to this calendar. I want us to get a sense of the rich history of our faith, while recognizing that the Church Year is not an excuse to live in the past; rather, it is an opportunity to learn how to live into the future God has planned for us all. The church calendar offers us stability by showing us the foundations of our faith in ways that are familiar and easy to follow. It also offers us the chance to celebrate with much variety and creativity as we move through the seasons of the year. Each season is designed help us encounter God in ways that remind us of God's actions in the past; that call us to our responses in the present; and that point us toward the glory of God in the future. The structure we follow is not haphazard or accidental; it is carefully built to lead us into a closer relationship with God.

The season we are in right now is often called "Kingdomtide" or "Ordinary Time". The liturgical color for this season is green which symbolizes new growth. This is time often used for spiritual growth studies, sermon series on specific topics, and exploring how we respond as Christians to God's call on our lives. Next time we will look more closely at what this time of year means for us and for the church. Meantime, be thinking in terms of growing in your relationship with God as we move through this season of green.


#### **Vacation Bible School**
