PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

"...do this in remembrance of me." (Luke 22:19)

This newsletter's installment on all things liturgical deals with the Sacrament of Holy

Communion. Jesus spoke the words above to all generations of believers when he instituted the sacrament of Holy Communion on the night he was arrested. He took bread and wine, gave thanks, blessed them, and gave them to his disciples with the command that they remember him by repeating this act whenever they gathered. It is a practice that has been repeated in churches small and large, around the world for over two thousand years. It is at the center of who we are as Christians because it commemorates the incredible sacrifice of Christ's passion, death, and resurrection on our behalf. Nothing is more significant to our faith than the events we remember every time we celebrate Holy Communion.

The story is told of a little girl whose parents had taken her forward to receive Holy Communion. Disappointed with the small piece of bread she was given to dip in the cup, the child cried loudly, "I want more! I want more!" While embarrassing to her parents and amusing to the pastor and congregation, this little girl's cry accurately expresses the feelings of many contemporary United Methodist people. We want more! We want more Jesus; we want more grace; we want more spiritual energy. In recent years many United Methodist Churches across the country have begun to reclaim the practice of celebrating weekly Holy Communion. John Wesley preached a sermon entitled, "The Duty of Constant Communion," in which he aims to "show that it is the duty of every Christian to receive the Lord's Supper as often as he can." Weekly communion is a reminder of the renewal of your covenant relationship with Jesus and constitutes a powerful experience of the Lord's presence in our midst. Receiving our Lord in the sacrament and taking him into you should be a time of awesome grace and power for each of us. If we prepare ourselves to welcome the Lord we will be rewarded with a sense of peace and mercy unlike any other.

As early as the Emmaus experience on the day of the Resurrection, (Luke 24:13-35) Christians recognized the presence of Jesus Christ in the breaking of the bread. The traditional Jewish practice of taking bread, blessing and thanking God, and breaking and sharing the bread took on new meaning for them. When followers of Christ gathered in Jesus' name, the

breaking of the bread and sharing of the cup was a means of remembering his life, death, and resurrection and of encountering the living Christ. This understanding remains with us today.

The practice of less frequent participation in the sacrament developed in the 18th Century when the number of elders was too small to offer the sacraments regularly to the rapidly increasing number of Methodists. During the decades of the Circuit Rider preachers, most Methodists were able to receive the Lord's Supper quarterly, at best, when the ordained elder came to their community. This is no longer an issue and yet the habit of weekly communion is slow to return to our churches

In accord with biblical teaching, we believe that we are sinners, constantly in need of divine grace. We believe that God is gracious and loving, always making available the grace we need. Grace is God's love toward us, God's free and undeserved gift. We believe that the sacraments are means of receiving God's grace and that Holy Communion is the only sacrament that can be repeated as often as you wish. (The other sacrament, Baptism is done only once.)

Holy Communion is an act of thanksgiving; joyful praise for all God's mighty acts throughout history. It is an act of fellowship; gathered together we partake of the one loaf and represent the Body of Christ for the whole world to see. It is remembrance; it is a re-presentation of the past that makes God present and alive to us in the present. It is a type of sacrifice; we cannot repeat Christ's sacrifice, but we can "offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us." It is an action of the Holy Spirit; communion is a vehicle of God's grace through the action of the Holy Spirit whose blessing we call upon ourselves and the elements of bread and wine. Finally, Holy Communion is eschatological – that is, it has to do with the end of time and God's purpose for the world. "Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again."

With all of this in mind, we are going to begin weekly communion on Sunday, August 25th. I ask you to approach the altar with reverence and encounter the Risen Christ with an open mind and heart.

Welcome Back Fun Night!


