

## WHERE DID ALL THAT MONEY GO FROM OUR LAST CAMPAIGN?

Three years ago, during our Time to Give Campaign, we said if we raised \$550,000, these things would be done:

- Make our annual land payment of \$64,000 for three years.
- 2. Pay \$30,000 each year toward our Apportionments for three years.
- 3. Complete our Family Life Center, including air conditioners, electrical work, bathrooms, etc.
- 4. Have two basketball goals installed at each end of the Life Center.
- Complete our Kitchen with commercial equipment
- 6. Install a children's playground
- 7. Repay our United Methodist Foundation loan of \$100,000.

We are very happy to report that with your Time to Give giving, plus a special gift from a will which was designated for furnishing the kitchen, we have completed each of the above with one exception. It was decided that it would be better to build the children's playground when the kids could be there to use it.

The money raised for the new Building for Life Campaign is to be used for the following:

- Make land payments for the next three years with the hopes of making nine years of payments in three years.
- 2. Make annual payments of \$30,000 for Apportionments for the next three years
- 3. Buy a new "People-Mover" style bus that will be easier for all ages to utilize for church activities.

These are the only three items that our new gifts will be used for.

We are excited to see what God can do through our Building for Life Giving Campaign and Spiritual Growth Emphasis! Thank you for letting us be a part of the leadership moving us forward to God's plan for SSUMC. Let us al ways remember:

If we will do all that we can - God will do what we can't!

#### **Building for the Future**

As many of you are aware, Boy Scout Troop 101 meets each Monday evening in our Family Life Center. The Scouting program is something I am particularly passionate about because I participated as a boy and again as an adult leader as my oldest son earned his Eagle badge. Scouting provides great opportunities for young men to learn valuable skills, develop lasting relationships, and become effective leaders. It is wonderful that our facility is available to foster this important youth program.

Soon we will be adding a Cub Scout Pack to our Scouting program at the FLC. This will bring a new dimension to the program by involving elementary aged boys and nurturing them toward joining the troop as they get older.

These two programs would not be possible without our Family Life Center. These groups had no other suitable place to meet. As a result of us helping them, boys from the troop have built a storage building at the FLC and done other service projects to help us. It is a great relationship that we should be proud of as we evaluate the success of our building program to date. The Family Life Center has blessed so many lives since its completion and Scouting is just one more example.

#### The "wind-up" and the final "pitch"...

When I came here just over two years ago I was so impressed with the level of activity and enthusiasm in a congregation this size...There seems to be something going on all the time and we are always looking for new ways to reach our community in Jesus' name. However, we are being held back by our aging facility.

Did you know...There are some members of church who no longer attending regularly because they have a hard time getting from their car to the front door? Parking is so inconvenient here that some of your

friends are unable to come to church. That is something we cannot fix at this location; the only way to fix the parking problem is to move.

There is no easy way for people with mobility issues to navigate between the Sanctuary and the Fellowship Hall. If you have trouble navigating the stairs, you must walk outside, down the sidewalk, around the corner, down the hill, and into the basement door. This is not a great solution in bad weather. Again, this is a problem we cannot solve in this location.

In the past two years we have had to replace two very expensive air conditioner units; we have repaired the sanctuary roof twice and it is still leaking in places; one leak also cost \$2,000 for repairs to the pipe organ; we found termites in Caleb House not long ago and treated for them; we have endured two floods in the past month; now we have discovered that the flooring under all the office areas is asbestos which will require expensive environmental abatement. This facility is costing us so much money in maintenance and repair that it is taking money away from our ability to do mission and ministry.

I believe that God has called this church to move aggressively forward with the plans to relocate to our south side property. Imagine what our mission and ministries will be like when they are thriving in a ministry center that is not falling apart; a ministry center where we have plenty of space for children's programming, youth programming, and additional adult classes. Imagine what kinds of mission we could offer our community with larger space and better parking. Visualize a playground for our children. Think about what a new church bus would mean to our ability to transport adults, youth, and children. Imagine the bus ministry we could start on Sunday mornings.

We need money to get there and the money belongs to God...You are just holding it for him. I pray that we will all be willing to listen to God's call and make a commitment to travel this journey together. Please pray earnestly as you and God decide together what you should do. We are building for the future life of our church and God is asking us to sacrifice for the future.
