#### Holy Communion...This Holy Mystery

Since we have begun celebrating Holy Communion each week, it seems important that we continue to examine the sacrament and what it means to the church. The United Methodist Church has a clear theology of the sacrament that goes back to John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist Movement. This understanding helps us appreciate the grace of God and the means we have of receiving God's grace in our lives. Over the next several newsletters we will spend some time reviewing some of this material in the hope that we all become more aware of what Communion means to us as followers of Christ and how important it is to our lives as Christians.

#### The Meaning of Holy Communion

The New Testament presents the major ideas that shape our understanding. A brief look at each of these will help us better comprehend the meaning of the sacrament.

Holy Communion is Eucharist, an act of thanksgiving. The early Christians "broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people" (Acts 2:46-47a). As we commune, we express joyful thanks for God's mighty acts throughout history — for creation, covenant, redemption, sanctification. The Great Thanksgiving is a recitation of this salvation history, culminating in the work of Jesus Christ and the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit. It conveys our gratitude for the goodness of God and God's unconditional love for us.

Holy Communion is the communion of the church — the gathered community of the

"Because there is one loaf, faithful, both local and universal. While deeply meaningful to the individuals participating, the sacrament is much more than a personal event. The first person pronouns throughout the ritual are consistently plural — we, us, and our. 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 10:17 explains that "because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread." The sharing and bonding experienced at the table exemplify the nature of the church and model the world as God would have it be.

Holy Communion is remembrance, commemoration, and memorial, but this remembrance is much more than simply intellectual recalling. "Do this in remembrance of me" (Luke 22:19; 1 Corinthians 11:24-25) is the dynamic calling to memory that becomes representation of past gracious acts of God in the present, so powerfully as to make them truly present now. Christ is risen and is alive here and now, not just remembered for what was done in the past.

Holy Communion is a type of sacrifice. It is a re-presentation, not a repetition, of the sacrifice of Christ. Hebrews 9:26 makes clear that "he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself." Christ's atoning life, death, and resurrection make divine grace available to us. We also present ourselves as sacrifice in union with Christ (Romans 12:1; 1 Peter 2:5) to be used by God in the work of redemption, reconciliation, and justice. In the Great Thanksgiving, the church prays: "We offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us..." (UMH; page 10). #### **Music Ministry Musings**

Don't forget that the Kingdom Kids present "The Perfect Gift" this Sunday evening at 6:00 pm in the sanctuary. This Christmas musical is going to be a really delightful way to begin your Christmas season. A Birthday Party for Jesus will follow with Birthday cake and punch. You won't want to miss it!

On Sunday, December 15th at 6:00 pm in the sanctuary the Chancel Choir will present "Appalachian Winter", a cantata that celebrates the legacy of early American carols and hymnody. Composed in the spirit of folk music, the cantata combines traditional sounds with more rustic elements, creating a blend that is fresh and exciting. Popular American carols like "Away loved Cathy Hula's. As Cathy's left arm is in a cast due in a Manger" and "O Little Town of Bethlehem" dance with traditional spirituals such as "Children, Go Where I Send Thee" and "Go, Tell It on the Mountain." Sacred Harp tunes are retooled for advent and stand alongside new versions of Shaker hymns and Appalachian melodies. Thoughtful narration weaves the movements together in a meaningful tapestry of song and Scripture. The Chancel Choir will be joined by the Chancel Ringers for a beautiful evening of music.






#### Just a Reminder...
