Jesus Stills the Storm

When Jesus got into the boat, his disciples followed him. A windstorm arose on the sea, so great that the boat was being swamped by the waves; but Jesus was asleep. And they went and woke him up,

saying, "Lord, save us! We are perishing!" And he said to them, "Why are you afraid, you of little faith?" Then he got up and rebuked the winds and the sea; and there was a dead calm. They were amazed, saying, "What sort of man is this, that even the winds and the sea obey him?" (Matthew 8:23-27, NRSV) On Sunday we talked about Matthew's account of Jesus walking on water in a storm and inviting Peter to join him. This text gives us another story about a storm that doesn't seem to concern Jesus very much. Storms – they are not uncommon events in Oklahoma and the term often describes the way our lives seem to be going. Thunder rolls, lightning flashes, and our lives get caught up in the swirling of a storm we cannot control. At some point we all find ourselves walking into or standing in the midst of or stepping out of the path of a storm that uproots and tosses parts of our life that we thought were safe, settled, and comfortable. When the storm hits we are seldom truly prepared for it; there is usually no early warning system; and we find ourselves dazed in the aftermath wondering where God was during that mess and why God let it happen to us.

Jesus asked his Disciples, "Why are you afraid?" To us, the answer may seem obvious – the boat is about to sink! Jesus has a whole different perspective on things. He talks about faith. In both of the "storm stories" in Matthew's gospel, Jesus chastises the disciples for their lack of faith. And I was reminded of a song...

"When storms of life assail When I am feeling frail. I place my trust in You, O Lord, You never fail.

In both of these stories the disciples reach out to Jesus in the midst of their fear. They find themselves in the middle of a storm and *then* they cry out for help. I have to wonder if this is the model that Jesus set for us to follow. It seems to me that Jesus did things differently.

In Sunday's message I talked about creating calm before the storm. To do this requires that we develop a strong and consistent prayer life. The idea is that, if we find ways to communicate with God every single day, then the stormy days will be less stressful for us. I believe that is what Jesus did. We often hear of times that

Jesus spent time alone in prayer. He found time to talk with his father all the time, not just when times were the toughest. It seems to me that had to help when he then went to pray the night he was arrested; the events about to happen to him were less stressful because he knew that God was walking with him into the storm. Certainly, what Jesus suffered is beyond anything we can imagine and most-likely worse than any storm we will ever face. A common question for many of us is why God causes or allows bad things to happen. We want to blame somebody when a storm comes and God seems like the obvious target. Who else has the power to put these things in our life? God has the power over life and death; God created the world to work the way it does; what happens to us must be God's "fault." I don't believe that is how things work. History and the Bible show us that things happen to us; bad things happen; good things happen; life just happens. God's place in all of this has always been alongside us. There are times in our life when there are no storms and everything goes along just fine. Then a crisis hits and our response reveals in whom we really have faith. Do we panic because we have been getting along just fine – all by ourselves, without God? Or do we remain calm because we have developed a relationship with God that trusts God through the good, the bad, and the ordinary? Can you imagine the great joy that would fill Jesus' heart when we

When we lived in Mangum we attended our share of Rattlesnake Roundups. There is a safety training class that goes along with this event that has always stayed with me. When a rattlesnake is in the area you are told to "be a tree"; to stay absolutely still and let the snake pass you by, unthreatened. They demonstrate this by standing still as a rattlesnake slithers across the toes of their boots and then wanders off into the desert. I am not advocating that we all go out and test this theory. I am reminded, though, of Psalm 46:10 – "Be still and know that I am God." Being still and allowing God's presence to fill your life will go a long way toward helping you withstand the onslaught of storms, even snakes.

I hope that you all are doing well and that your summer was fun and brought you plenty of rest.


It is hard to believe that school is one week away, summer flew by and we will back in the swing of school very quickly.
