"His grace which was bestowed on me was not in vain."

(1 Corinthians 15:10)

The fact that we have received God's grace in our lives should be cause for

celebration and it should be a source of joy and hope every day. Oswald Chambers writes: "The way we continually talk about our own inability is an insult to the Creator. The deploring of our own incompetence is a slander against God for having overlooked us."

We need to be aware that sometimes the way we think of or describe ourselves, intending to show humility, may really be an insult in God's eyes. Being "humble before God" is not the same thing as sounding humble before other people.

Think about that for a minute. We tend to be selfdeprecating in front of others, down-playing the good that we do and even our good intentions. "Oh, I wouldn't say that I am such a good person; I'm certainly no saint!" But saying those same words before God is not so much humble as it is insulting. "No, Lord, it is impossible for you to save and sanctify me; there are chances I have not had; so many imperfections in my brain and body; no, Lord, it just isn't possible for you to work through me." That may sound humble in front of a human audience, but to God it is a statement of ingratitude and distrust. We should rather be open to saying thank you to God for the ways in which God uses us and trusts us and allows us to share God's love with the world. We do not need to be "a saint" to serve God; God can and does work with us fall into place exactly as they should. Maintain your relain spite of our imperfections. In fact, I believe God often uses us **because** of our imperfections to reach people who share our faults and weaknesses. Think about that for a moment. Is it possible that God is guiding you to someone right now who is like you in many ways, yet who has not yet found a relationship with Jesus? Maybe your similarities will act as a way for you to help lead that person to Christ. If you were "a saint," you might not have that same opportunity.

We are truly humble before God when we can say that we have completely abandoned ourselves to the point that all that we are and all that we have is at God's disposal. That's not bragging if it is the truth. Other people might hear that as pride, but God hears it as humble submission to God's grace and perfect will. The great thing is that it really doesn't matter what other people think anyway; it only matters what God thinks.

I believe we spend way too much time worrying about what other people think of us. We are concerned about how others view our motives; we worry too much about the way we look on the outside; we hesitate to act for fear of offending someone. The problem with that sort of thinking is that it places the opinions of others above God's opinion and that is a dangerous thing for us to do. We can never truly measure-up to the opinions of other people because people are imperfect and fickle. How we view others and how they view us is constantly changing; we cannot and should not try to live by ever-moving expectations. God sees us in a constant vision of us as God's children - imperfect, but loved; sinful, and yet redeemed. Living up to God's expectations is as simple as recognizing our true self and then letting God be in charge of every day. I know it sounds simpler than it really is, but we can do it if we understand the priorities of our relationships.

There is only one relationship that really matters and that is your personal relationship with God. If that relationship is in order, then all your other relationships will tionship with God at all costs and God will fulfill His purpose through your life. We cannot know the full extent of what God can do in and through us unless we trust God to do God's work.

We'll see you Sunday!


