"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." (Jeremiah 29:11, NIV)

I think I have mentioned before that this passage from Jeremiah is one of my very favorites; it is my "go-to" text anytime I am wondering what's going on in my life. I know there are many people who recall this scripture frequently and find comfort in its words. It is, however, necessary for us to recognize that this comforting use of the text does not fit with the original context of its writing. Jeremiah 29:4 says: "This is what the Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, says to all those I carried into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon..." The writer is not speaking to an individual in this passage; he is speaking to a large group of people – an entire nation. The "you" is plural, not singular. You may be thinking, "So what; the message is the same whether it is meant for one person or a group of people." In a sense, that is correct. However, it is important that we allow Scripture to speak to us and not allow our personal views to speak into the Scriptures what we want to hear.

What we notice in this context is that God has plans for the whole nation of Israel. After their exile God plans to restore the nation and put them on a path to redemption. Reading this verse in its context tells us that we are all in this thing **together**, as a group – the Body of Christ. There is a plan for us as individuals, but we exist as individuals who are also members of a larger group. Reading this beloved verse as if it were written only to me as an individual robs it of its deeper meaning for me as a member of Christ's body. The plan and the promise then are bigger than any single one of us; it is for and about <u>all</u> of us.

Here we are in January 2015; it is the beginning of another year. We have spent time looking back on the good and the bad of 2014; we have celebrated Christmas with family and friends. It is time now to begin to move forward into what will be for us in 2015. I believe that God has a pretty good idea of who we will be this year and what we will do. God has a plan for us and it is a good plan, I have no doubt. The question seems to be: "Will we allow God's plan to speak to us and will we have the courage to do what God asks of us?" Already the leaders of your church have been working to

discern God's plan and to be ready to implement it. In 2015 we will spend a lot of time teaching and learning more about what it means to be a member of the church. You will see sermon series, study groups, and activities built around the five ways we all promised to support our church: prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. Your Church Council will be aggressively seeking ways to move forward from the foundations we learned during the ARISE process last Fall. Your leaders will be looking for ways to involve more people in the mission and ministry of the church at every level. We will be providing many resources for training and enrichment for leaders and team members in a variety of ministry areas. We will begin to discover how our local church will participate as a ministry partner in the re-defined District structure of the UMC and the missional area that we will be joining.

As you know, our Staff Parish Relations Committee continues to face challenges as they seek to recruit a Youth Director to lead our young people. In the interim, Kent Warkentin and a group of dedicated volunteers are running our youth program. I am extremely grateful to this team for their dedication and I ask for your prayers as they manage their jobs and families while setting aside time to plan for and work with our youth.

I continue to reflect on Jeremiah 29:11 and how it has spoken to me personally through the years; I can still hear its message for me as an individual. I also hear its message as a clear promise to all of us as the Body of Christ to recognize God's plans and promises. Jeremiah was talking to the nation of Israel and we – the church today – can also hear his words for us. We are all in this together and God makes his promises to us as a group. God has a plan to set us on the path that leads us to redemption; God has a plan to guide us as we do the kingdom work needed in our community today. God also makes a promise that the result of this plan will be more than we ever dreamed possible. We only need to pay attention and follow the leader – Jesus Christ.

Christians have prayed this simple, yet profound prayer for centuries. This powerful initiative can be a point of unity for all of us across denominations to bridge the divides of doctrine and polity that seem so evident in Christ's Body. As this initiative spreads, more and more people of every denomination are participating and creating an enormous chain of prayers that begins at noon each day, regardless of time zone.
