"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you."

(Matthew28:19-20a)

The job of every Christian is, to the best of your ability, to follow the instructions of Jesus to his disciples. We are to make disciples; we are to teach. Doing that in our contemporary culture can be a real challenge for us. We are very busy; we have many responsibilities. When and how are **we** going to become evangelists, running around converting people and planning baptisms? Does Jesus really mean that **we** – the people of the 21st Century church – are supposed to teach the gospel and help people develop a relationship with him? Isn't that why we have clergy persons? Don't we pay **them** to do this hard stuff so we don't have to? The answers to these questions, in order, are: always, in all ways; yes; no; and no.

Now, the way to wrap your head around this is to realize that, in many ways, **you are already doing this work**. To make this point clear, I want to take my time this week to remind you of what you are doing around here.

It is the beginning of another year. It is the time when many people who serve on the various committees and boards change jobs or agree to continue. We also welcome new people into various jobs. Sometimes we think of all this "committee stuff" as just something we must do to satisfy Conference requirements. It becomes a chore that somebody must do, so we force ourselves to fill the committee spots. After that, we forget what the real work of these committees is and how it relates to The Great Commission of Jesus Christ. The first thing I want to do today is say "THANK YOU!" to all those who have been serving for the past year and to those who will continue to serve this year.

Next, I want you to remember how important your roles are to the life of the church. Begin with our **Church Council**. This group is made up of representatives from every ministry area in the church. I use the word "ministry" because everything you do here is ministry; I am not the only minister, simply because I have credentials on my wall. You are all ministers of Christ. The Church Council hears from every area of ministry about

plans, needs, and accomplishment. The idea is to be sure that everyone stays in touch with what's going on and seeks ways to help each other accomplish the work. This is the group that lays out the vision and plans for our future as a church.

Then we have the **Board of Trustees**. This oftenmisunderstood group is charged with managing all the physical assets of the congregation. Buildings, vehicles, and investments are all under their purview; they are not our personal repair people.

The **Finance Committee** is another group we often misunderstand. This group is formed by the leaders of other administrative groups. They are responsible to oversee the financial records of the church and offer advice to the Church Council about how to best raise funds and manage expenses. This group develops the annual budget. The Finance Committee does **not** spend money; in fact, this group has no authority – they only supervise and advise.

Then we have the **Staff Parish Relations Committee** who acts as our human resources department. All their work is confidential, as it should be. The **Nominations Committee** serves a similar function with regards volunteers. This committee recruits members to serve as volunteers on all the administrative and service groups in the church.

Finally, we have groups who do the work of children's ministry, mission and outreach, congregational care, prayer, adult education, and youth ministry. There are also many folks involved in United Methodist Women, the Community Thanksgiving Dinner project, and other things that come up throughout the year.

Each one of you who participate as a committee member or a volunteer in any of these areas is working on The Great Commission. You are making disciples by showing other people the love of Jesus Christ. You are helping the church find those who want to know more about Jesus. You participate in every baptism as you affirm your promises and welcome every new member into the congregation. *WOW!* When you look at it that way, maybe you begin to see how important our committees really are <u>AND</u> how much you are already doing as a minister of Christ. Thank you and keep up the good work!
