"All of you are God's children because of your faith in Christ Jesus. And when you were baptized, it was as though you had put on

Christ in the same way you put on new clothes. Faith in Christ Jesus is what makes each of you equal with each other, whether you are a Jew or a Greek, a slave or a free person, a man or a woman. So if you belong to Christ, you are now part of Abraham's family, and you will be given what God has promised." (Galatians 3:26-29)

This past Sunday we celebrated Confirmation with four of our students. Two of these students also received Baptism over the weekend. These four are now full members of our congregation. It is an exciting time when we see young people come to understand their faith and make their own profession of faith. This year's class shows us a good example of how our United Methodist "system" works.

Two of these students were baptized as infants. The promises to reject sin and live according to God's will were made for these children when they had no opportunity to participate. The other two students came through the Confirmation process and then chose to receive Baptism for themselves. They were able to make their own promise to reject sin and live according to God's will. In the UMC, Confirmation brings these students to the same place regardless of when they were baptized. During the Confirmation ceremony, all four students reaffirmed their baptismal promises; they all proclaimed Jesus Christ as Savior; and they all entered the church together in full membership.

We believe that Baptism is an essential part of everyone's journey with Christ. We also believe that it is God who acts in Baptism, so that we accept a person's Baptism whether done as an infant or as an older person. Baptism is not about what we do or what the church does or the way in which it is performed. Baptism is about what God does in terms of offering us grace and forgiveness, and the salvation we receive through Jesus Christ. God's actions on our behalf are available to us at any stage in life.

Baptism and our profession of faith leads us into the community of the Body of Christ. Within this community we are nurtured in our faith, no matter how old we are. This community is vital to our growth as disciples of Jesus. We cannot be Christians all alone; we need the community to strengthen us all along our faith journey. When a child is baptized, those who answer for them are charged with providing the proper care needed to lead the child to a future declaration of faith. This is no less true of children who come to us without Baptism; we are obligated to nurture them and lead them to their profession of faith. That same nurture and care is for all of us – child and adult – we need each other.

As we celebrate with our students this year, let us also celebrate our community of faith. We are in this together as the Body of Christ. "Remember your Baptism and be thankful." Being a disciple is an ongoing process that should be our life's work.

OUR WORSHIP SPACE

You may have noticed some recent changes in the arrangement of our worship space. If you were able to view the space from above, you would see that the center aisle (known as the "nave") is intersected by a rectangular space (known as the "transept"). The nave and the transept form a cross. We have now located our Communion Table at the center of this intersection, placing the Eucharist – the symbol of Christ's death and resurrection, at the focal point of our worship space. This placement also enables us to "come to the table" when we receive Holy Communion. We believe that this symbolism enhances our understanding of the sacrament and its central place in our worship.

DID YOU KNOW? The Sand Springs United Methodist Women host two fundraisers a year: A bake sale, held during the Sand Springs Herbal Festival in April and the Memorial Flower Sale prior to Memorial Day in May. With the funds generated by the two events (approximately \$3,415 in 2015!), the SSUMW supports various local and state missions such as: SS Community Services, Restore Hope, Project Transformation, the Methodist Manor, Tu's Wesley Foundation, Circle of Care, New Day Camp and Volunteers in Mission. Within the SS United Methodist Church, the funds help to support Youth Program and Missions,

fully funding one youth to attend their mission trip this summer; Vacation Bible School; provide the meat dishes for bereavement meals for church members and their families; celebrate our SSUMC graduating seniors from high school or college; and, purchase bibles for the young ladies we honor with a breakfast when graduating high school through the Margaret Hudson Program. In addition to these programs, we were able to purchase four new High Chairs for the Family Life Center and two 8 x 8 canopies. The canopies provide protection from the elements during the Herbal Festival bake sale but are available for church activities. For our local unit, we purchase books for the UMW Reading Program, housed in our church library within a separate section but are available for all. For any of our UMW members wishing to attend UMW District and State Events, we are able to help offset the costs of these events. Wow!
