Dear friends in Christ,

Well, this past Sunday, June 11<sup>th</sup>, officially marks the beginning of our 7<sup>th</sup> year serving Sand Springs UMC. Linda and I are very happy to be returning to this parish for another year. Looking back over these past six years, we see so many things that have changed and so much work that has been done. We are truly blessed to be here. Particularly this past year, you have loved and supported us through a very difficult time in our personal lives. Thank you for all you have done and all your prayers during this part of our journey.

Looking forward, there is still much work to be done and change yet to manifest. I believe we must always be looking for new ways to serve God's people and share the love of Christ. We must also be on the lookout for where God chooses to send us and how God intends for us to tell others about Jesus.

On Pentecost Sunday, I quoted Bishop Jimmy Nunn when he said: *"The Holy Spirit is fixin' to grab Oklahoma by the Panhandle and shake things up!"* I must agree with Bishop Nunn. I am convinced that God has big plans for the church in our state and in our community. I believe that God is far from finished with us and is not about to let us be finished with ourselves either. We should be excited about the prospects of what God has in mind. How will we respond to God's call?

The most currently available data suggests that only 14.7% of the people living in our zip code respond that, "My faith is really important to me." 18.3% say that, "It is important to attend religious services." I could be wrong, but this seems to indicate to me that most of our neighbors in Sand Springs do not attend church, nor do they feel their faith is important. That is a sobering thought!

16,000 people in Sand Springs have no meaningful relationship with God. Well, how can they "call for help if they don't know who to trust? And how can they know who to trust if they haven't heard of the One who can be trusted? And how can they hear if nobody tells them? And how is anyone going to tell them, unless someone is sent to do it?"

I hope you see where I'm going with this. Each one of you has a particular gift, talent, skill, or passion that God gave you, with the idea that you would use that gift to help other people figure out who they can trust – Jesus. As a congregation, we have pooled our gifts and our resources to offer opportunities for others to encounter Jesus. We have two facilities in this community with different strengths and weaknesses. Each of these has something to offer to people seeking to know more about what it means to follow Jesus. It is our ministry to use what we have to reach more people, in different ways, and show them a trusted Savior.

Studies tell us that we can no longer do church the way we have done it in the past. Church is no longer central in the community; religion is no longer the most important thing for most people; lifestyle choices have placed unrealistic pressure on the time we have available. Church cannot continue to expect people to come to church on Sunday morning, never missing a Sunday. That is not what people think of as being a church member anymore.

We need to be asking, "How will we reach those in our community who have no relationship with Christ?" We should not ask, "How do we get those folks to come to our church?" We can't focus on helping all those people see things "our way"; rather, we need to figure out how to meet them where they are and guide them as they discover Jesus for themselves. That is how and where we are being sent.

This summer I am asking everyone in our congregation to imagine new ways to be the church in Sand Springs. I am praying for the Holy Spirit to inspire us with fresh ideas. I am also challenging all of us to look at everything we are now doing and figure out what is working well, in terms of making and shaping true disciples, and what is just action born of tradition, but not serving the mission of discipleship. Let us discern together what God has in mind for SSUMC.

## In case you were wondering...


There are still UMW Blue Cookbooks available.

## Sister's Swiss Steak

2 lb. round steak
1 c. flour
1 T. dry mustard
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. pepper
Oil
1 (15 1/2 oz.) can stewed tomatoes
2 carrots, sliced
1 lg. onion, chopped
1 T. brown sugar
2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

Dredge meat in a mixture of flour, dry mustard, salt and pepper; brown in a skillet with a small amount of oil and place in a casserole dish. Rinse skillet with a small amount of water and pour over steak. Mix tomatoes, carrots, onion, brown sugar and Worcestershire sauce; pour over the meat in the casserole. Cover and bake 2 hours at 325°.
