"No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us." (1 John 4:12, NIV)

This past Sunday in our message

we once again encountered the question, "Who is Jesus?" We talked about how important the answer to that question really is in each person's life. How you answer that question affects everything else about you and your life of faith. We also talked about why Jesus had to come to earth and what difference that makes in our understanding of God and our relationship with God. If you answer the "Who is Jesus?" question — he is the Son of God, the Messiah, then today's devotion makes much more sense. During our conversation on Sunday, someone made the point that Jesus coming to earth made God accessible to all of us. Jesus brought the presence of God into our world and then, when he returned to heaven, he left the Holy Spirit behind to maintain God's presence in our world.

In John's first letter we are reminded that none of us have ever seen God face to face. However, the first Disciples were able to see God in the face of Jesus while he was with them. Jesus' presence in the world allowed human beings to actually see God face to face and talk with him and walk with him, reminiscent of the old hymn, "In the Garden".

My devotional for today (from Jesus Calling) challenges us to rest in Jesus' presence because the world in which we live "seems to spin faster and faster, till everything is a blur." Jesus offers us stability at the center of this swirling storm every day. It is at this "soothing center" that we can be re-fueled with all the promises Christ made before he left. Remember in the Gospel of John, Jesus told the disciples that he would not leave them as "orphans"; he promised to send the Holy Spirit to live with us, guide us, and teach us to love. (John 14:15-21). In Galatians 5:22, Paul wrote, "the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, good-

ness, faithfulness." So, as we rest in the soothing center of Jesus presence' we are filled again with all these wonderful, refreshing gifts promised by Jesus to come to us through the Holy Spirit.

I think that sometimes we feel so overwhelmed by our circumstances and get a little lost in the whirlwind. It's easy to seek solutions to our problems from people and things of this world. We feel comfortable commiserating with others who feel as we do and who share some of the same problems we have. "Misery loves company," the old saying goes, and we may seek to alleviate our suffering by looking for those who are more miserable than we are. We may even seek to drown our misery in a sea of alcohol or prescription drugs. It's interesting how we sometimes seek to fix our own problems only to discover that they just keep getting worse under our expedient care.

"The world is a needy place; do not go there for sustenance," writes Sarah Young, author of "Jesus Calling."
"Learn to depend on Me alone, and your weakness will become saturated with My Power. When you find your completeness in Me, you can help other people without using them to meet your own needs. Live in the Light of My Presence, and your light will shine brightly into the lives of others."

We talked on Sunday about how it is vital that Christianity be lived-out in community. We support one another; we pray with and for one another. We do these things in the power of Jesus, not in our own power. It is God's presence with and in us that makes this community possible. Rest in the radiant presence of Jesus; find peace and strength there. Christianity is unique because God is truly present with us because of Jesus Christ and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Because of Jesus God's love is made complete in us.
