

"No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us." (Romans 8:37, NIV)
Once again this morning, Oswald Chambers (My Utmost for His Highest) seems to be listening in on SSUMC. Today's devotion is titled,

"Undaunted Radiance" and

grows out of this verse from Paul's Letter to the Romans. Paul is talking about the many things that seem to separate or drive a wedge in between the love of God and the believer. That is the overarching theme of our Journey of Stones this Lenten Season. There are so many things that get in the way of our relationship with God and we must constantly be aware of removing those obstacles. That is why I have taken the time to use the symbolism of stones being picked up and then laid down at the foot of the cross. The stones we use in worship each week represent our sins, our missteps, our greed, our selfishness, our impatience, and all the many other things that stand between us and a faithful relationship with Jesus. Paul's reassurance is that none of these things are more powerful than the love of God. Listen as he continues to write:

"For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39, NRSV).

What that really means is that not even the depths of alcoholism or drug addiction can be so dark that Christ cannot see in and pull you out. There is no condition of substance abuse where God cannot

be present to walk with and heal the addict. That also means that there is no addiction that should prevent us from reaching out to offer hope and love for the addict.

Paul tells us that job loss or the fear of job loss is no match for the assurance that Jesus can and will stand beside you in the midst of it. Worries about the economic doom and gloom we hear about every day are the stuff that stones are made from and they need to be left at the foot of the cross. Paul assures us that our selfishness, our lack of forgiveness, our tendency to gossip, our turning away from people in need, our pride, our aggression, and our constant battles against temptation are no match for the love of God in Christ Jesus. Nothing, not even our own mighty efforts, can destroy us if we will rest in the loving arms of Christ and let go of the stones that weigh us down.

Believe me when I say that I am painfully aware of how difficult it can be to let go of things that get in the way. It is an ongoing effort to identify these stones and then lay them at the cross; and the stones just keep coming. Hear these words as Dr. Chambers closes today's devotion:

"Undaunted radiance is not built on anything passing, but on the love of God that nothing can alter. The experiences of life, terrible or monotonous, are impotent to touch the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Undaunted radiance = unshrinking brilliance – the Light of Christ in and through us.
