

Dear Friends in Christ,

The Easter celebration is over. Christ has been raised and our redemption is complete. So, what happens now? What difference does Easter really make in your life each day? Jesus spent his life showing us ways to live more closely to the way God intended. He showed us how to care for one another; how to love unconditionally; how to give ourselves generously. All that Jesus said and did was about helping us become the people God intended so that we might have life more fully in His name. Yet, I wonder what happens now.

Easter morning was a great day for our church. We welcomed large crowds into our sanctuary, we sang wonderful worship songs, and we rejoiced as hundreds of tissue-paper butterflies were released into the air. There was good food and fellowship. Now, we've cleaned up the butterflies, sent the lilies home to be planted, and the crowds are thinning out again. Did Easter make any difference at all?

Imagine sitting vigil at the bedside of your spouse, your child, or a sibling. All the signs are bad and the doctors have told you to be prepared to say goodbye. You understand, but you also know you will miss this person terribly. Then the signs change and your loved one revives and recovers from whatever had threatened their life. Would you not rejoice? Would you not want to spend every possible moment with them?

We watched with the Disciples as Jesus suffered and died. Then we rejoiced at his resurrection. Should we not now want to spend as much time as possible with Jesus? The more time we spend with him, the more we realize who we are meant to be. We discover that the life he asks us to live is challenging; we also begin to understand that this life will improve the lives of others and we will be so much happier as a result.

Jesus did not establish a church with doctrinal standards, confessions of faith, and rules for order and discipline. Jesus started a movement driven by love for God and love for others. We cannot fully embrace this movement unless and until we are willing to love without judgment or fear.

John Wesley famously wrote: "Though we cannot think alike, may we not love alike? May we not be of one heart, though we are not of one opinion? Without all doubt, we may. Herein all the children of God may unite, notwithstanding these smaller differences."

I believe that Easter should make a big difference in the way we live each day. It should help us realize what is truly important in life and what is just noise. It should empower us to think differently about other people because they are as much children of God as we are. It should help us see beyond the pain and struggle we face in this world, into the promise of eternity in the presence of Jesus. Easter is about healing and wholeness, redemption and love. It is a celebration that should last all year long. If you believe that you have the right to enjoy this celebration, then you must also believe that every other human being has the same right.

It seems to me that many people argue over a wide variety of issues simply because they are not listening to the person they are arguing with. They are not listening because they do not respect the other's opinions. They do not respect the other's opinions because they do not respect the other as a loved child of God. We have forgotten that we are all in this world together and we allow division to grow out of differences of opinion over details that often do not matter; at least, details that do not matter to God. Bishop Karen Olivetto recently said this: "I believe this is what John Wesley meant when he said, "In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things, charity." He wove into the very fabric of the Methodist movement a vigorous tension of difference that enlivens unity, not detracts from it."

We may never agree with everyone, we can, however, love them and expect love from them, if we treat everyone as Easter People. We must stop focusing on the petty details that divide us and generously accept that which unites us. God loves all of Creation, whether we do or not. Maybe we should learn a lesson about love from God. (John 3:16)

All churches in the Oklahoma Annual Conference now have access to the Real Discipleship Survey online. This system, designed by Phil Maynard, offers a way for churches to survey their maturity on six dimensions of the discipleship journey. This service is offered to all OKUMC churches free of charge. The survey measures: a life of worship, a life of hospitality, a life open to Jesus, a life of obeying Jesus, a life of service, and a life of generosity.

Upon taking the survey, participants discover if they are exploring, beginning, growing, or maturing in each of those categories.

1.) Sign Up: Visit: http://discipleshipsurvey.com/ member.html and enter our conference code:

2.) Create Account: In order to take the Real Disciple-ship Survey online you will need to enter an email address and create a secure password. Choose your District (COUNCIL OAK) and your church from the dropdown lists, fill out the email and password fields and then click the blue "Sign Up" button. Use the click here link on the next screen to continue. You can also access the survey by visiting http://

<u>discipleshipsurvey.com/memberlogin.html</u> after creating your account.

- 3.) Log In: Enter the password and email address you provided in step 2 in order to log in.
- 4.) Choose Your Groups: We have chosen to measure the survey statistics both at the churchwide level and by individual church groups. Use the blue "Edit Profile" button to select the group(s) to which you belong. (ie: Church Council, Teachers/Leaders, etc.) Simply choose YES for those groups to which you belong.
- 5.) Take Survey: Take the Real Discipleship Survey by clicking the blue "Take Survey" button and then selecting the one box of each color that fits you best. After completing the survey use the blue "Submit Survey" button. Your results will be displayed for you at that time. You may also select to view additional information or have your results sent to your email account. You may use http://discipleshipsurvey.com/memberlogin.html to log in and view your results at any time. You will also be able to retake the survey at

a later date in order to measure changes in your discipleship over time.
