"Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; give, and it will be given to you." (Luke 6:37-38a, NRSV)

I want to share part of an article

that appeared in the September 2017 issue of *Christianity Today*. Entitled, *What Did Jesus Mean by "Judge Not"?* - It was written by Pastor Skye Jethani.

"In 2007 a book was published called *Un-Christian: What a New Generation Really Thinks about Christianity*. It's based on research done among non-Christian 20-somethings. One of their core findings was that nearly nine out of ten young people view Christians as "judgmental." And given the prohibition against judging issued by Jesus, this would mean most people view Christians as hypocrites."

"Given these findings, it's pretty important that both Christians and non-Christians understand what Jesus means when he says, "judge not." The key is recognizing that the word judge can be used in two different ways in the New Testament. Sometimes judge is used to mean "judge between things," to differentiate, or discern. In this case we judge between right and wrong, good and evil, righteous and unrighteous."

"It is the second definition. to condemn, that Jesus forbids and he makes that clear when the whole sentence in Luke 6 is read: "Judge not, and you will not be judged; condemn not, and you will not be condemned." He's calling us to not condemn people, to not pass final judgment and declare them irretrievably guilty. This is an incredibly important idea if you understand the context in which Jesus was speaking." "This is the judgment that Jesus says is absolutely wrong. When we judge/condemn someone we are declaring that they have no value; no worth - that they do not matter to us or God. And we do this as a means of elevating ourselves." Being a follower of Jesus has never been easy. It is always worth the effort, but it comes with so many challenges and obstacles along the way. Maybe that's why everyone doesn't bother to even try to follow Jesus and maybe that's why we have a hard time attracting new people. It's just too hard. Then there's that little matter of being perceived as "too judgmental."

When you read all of Pastor Jethani's article, you begin to see

how he puts his thesis together and you also begin to see how many of us fall into the trap of being judgmental in the sense that Jesus forbids in Luke's gospel. As Christians, we are obligated to discern between right and wrong, good and evil. We are not the final arbiters of this morality, but we try to do our best to understand the difference between "should" and "should not." However, this is very different from the judgment that leads to condemnation of any human being. As Jethani said so well: "When we judge/condemn someone we are declaring that they have no value; no worth - that they do not matter to us or God." This is the judgment that is forbidden by Jesus. None of us has the ability, the knowledge, or the perfect understanding that is required for real judgment; this is why judgment is reserved for God and only God.

Jesus tells us to be discerning so we know good from evil. At the same time, Jesus commands us to love every other human being, even our enemies. We will always encounter sinful people; we are sinful people ourselves. God loves us and forgives us, in spite of our sin. So then, we must also forgive, and love, and respect every other, even when they are struggling with their own faults. We are all struggling with our faults. It's hard to see the plank in our own eye when we spend so much time picking at the splinter in somebody else's eye. We sooth ourselves by talking about such as things as, "hating the sin and loving the sinner;" what that really does is translate as plain hate. We trust that because we understand the nuanced definitions of "judgment", everyone must also understand. What we know in our hearts is that this is simply not true. Others do not understand the nuance, they only feel the hypocrisy. When we do the work that Jesus calls us to, we must find ways to connect with all kinds of people in lots of different places and situations. We will engage those we agree with and those with whom we disagree. Our disagreements may grow out of our differing judgments of what is right and what is wrong. We must not let these differences cause us to make judgments about the value of other humans - all humans are valued by God.

If we truly want to be the church in the world today (not of the world), we must build relationships with people who need and seek the love of God and the good news of salvation through Jesus Christ. In the process, judge not.
