"I do not count my life of any value to myself, if only I may finish my course and the ministry that I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the good news of God's

grace." (Acts 20:24)

Good ol' Oswald Chambers does it again! In his devotional for March 5, he reminds us of these words from Luke and then challenges us to answer this question: "Is He really Lord in your life?"

I needed to read over this several times before I was able to be honest enough to work through what Chambers says. He begins with, "Joy means the perfect fulfillment of that for which I was created and regenerated, not the successful doing of things." The implications of that single sentence are awesome. First, "joy" must never be confused for happiness, satisfaction, or success. Joy is preceded by the self-awareness of what you were created for, in the first place, and what God intended for you when you accepted your salvation from Jesus Christ. After this self-awareness, true joy is only possible as we follow God's leadership (hear "Lordship") and fulfill our true purpose.

When Jesus was sending out his disciples, he told them, "As my Father has sent me, so I am sending you." In the same way and with the same purpose and expectations, we are sent out into a ministry chosen for us by God. It is our duty to be loyal to that calling and count our lives precious only for the fulfillment of that ministry. It is not always easy to discern the particular ministry God has in store for you. Parent, spouse, doctor, accountant, preacher – these are just some of the infinite possibilities where God places people so that they may be witnesses to God's Good News. To find our particular place, we must listen for God to guide us and allow God to aid us in our decision -making. It is a spiritual exercise to determine the route our temporal lives will travel. But imagine the true joy of

hearing Jesus say to you, "Well done, good and faithful servant;" knowing that you have done what God sent you to do. I don't think we can count on that joy unless we make Jesus the true "Lord" of our lives; therein lies the tough part.

We are pushed and pulled in so many directions and we are bombarded with so many opinions and so much advice. Everyone seems to think they know best what you should do and how you should behave. (I guess they forgot that 2X4 in their own eye!) In the midst of all this, we must make room for God's voice to break through. Otherwise, we may be fooled into believing that we're doing all the right things because people seem to like what we're doing. That was one thing Jesus didn't care about — whether or not other people liked what he was doing; only God's opinion mattered.

Jesus showed us and told us what we needed to do if we loved him, if we believed he was "Lord." He told us to feed, clothe, welcome, care for, love the least and the lost and the lonely. There does not seem to be a choice to serve; I only hear a commission from the Lord himself. The need around us is not the call; the need is our opportunity to serve our Lord and move toward true joy.

Chambers points out that, the reason we must discern the direction God has in mind for us is because we need to able to follow God's voice in all our work. That means that we must also be able to avoid wandering away from God's lead by trying to do everything for everyone. There will always be more demand than you can handle, but there will also always be ministers of God who are called to handle the need that you can't. Pray for all of God's ministers to hear their calling and answer. And remember that we are talking about "the ministry of all believers." We are all in this together, no matter where God has placed us.

#### **Mission to Stitch Testimony**

Olivia Tackett works as a Registered Nurse in Labor and Delivery. She has delivered items made by UMW for a while and wants us to know how much the items mean to families who experience loss.

... I have experienced many emotions. Being a Registered Nurse in Labor and Delivery is a wonderful opportunity to help a woman who has never experienced the birth of a child before. Helping her overcome her fears and concerns. Then to see the face of her newborn baby! All moms have experienced it. It

is a sign of God's wish for us to carry on, that the future carries hope for the world by His design. Olivia shared the tragedies of loss as well. Finding out a mom is carrying a stillborn baby; the trauma. Just last year, St. Francis Hospital in Tulsa had 4,147 babies born. And of those, 46 were found stillborn prematurely.

Olivia says they are so grateful to the United Methodist Women for their hard work in making and providing 975 infant caps for all delivered babies, no matter the situation. 101 baby blankets were also made to be given as keepsakes to those who have lost. The UMW also provided 140 burial gowns for those babies who did not make it to term. Each family is given one for the baby and an identical one that is placed in a Keepsake Box as a memory.

They also made 33 handkerchiefs for the families who experience the loss of their baby.

Every year, the hospital has a special "Angel Tree Ceremony" in December. Families who experienced the loss of their baby that year can attend to celebrate the life of their child. Some continue to return for the celebration year after year. They are given a special ornament with their child's name on it. Last year, UMW provided 180 angel ornaments.

This year, St. Francis Hospital in Tulsa will branch out to Muskogee Regional Medical Center to assist them with launching a fetal loss program. We know the UMW will help to make this project successful with their continued support.

Thank you for all you do and know that these little items will be held and loved for a lifetime by these families!
