After these things, the Lord commissioned seventy-two others and sent them on ahead in pairs to every city and place he was about to go. He said to them, "The harvest is bigger

than you can imagine, but there are few workers. Therefore, plead with the Lord of the harvest to send out workers for his harvest." (Luke 10:1-2, CEB) As faithful people, we are called to reach out to help others find their way to Jesus. As a congregation, we are constantly seeking to know what God expects from us and how we might fulfill our call. This week, I want to share a story with you, taken from a book called, "Engaging Your Community: A Guide to Seeing All the People," written by Junius B. Dotson. Rev. Dotson was a featured speaker at our Annual Conference this year, and his book is being used by churches all over Oklahoma as a study in faithful discipleship. The following summary concerns an experiment from 2016 that attempted to discover how four minutes of staring into the eyes of another human being, different from yourself might bring two people closer.

Two people are led into a room; their eyes are closed. They are seated in front of each other within arm's length: one, a refugee fleeing a war-torn country; one, a European in a country struggling to respond to the refugee crisis. They open their eyes have been instructed not to speak for four minutes, looking directly at the other person for the duration. Some break the rules immediately, saying, "I like your mustache." "Are you new to Berlin?" "How old are you?" The exercise appears awkward at first for some, but for others it immediately creates smiles. Some cannot handle the intensity and look away. Some begin to cry. At the end of the exercise, all smile, some stand and embrace, some hold hands. Some make plans to visit a local zoo together. Two children upon finishing the experiment begin to play a game of tag.

Looking into another's eyes drives us to a surprisingly deep connection. In just four minutes – without words – friendships begin to form. How is that possible? What is it about a simple human encounter such as this? Why does this experiment elicit such a powerful response – with just the simple act of *seeing* another and *being seen* by another?

I believe Jesus understood this principle as he sent the disciples out with instructions for vulnerability and consistency — to be fully present in the moment, perhaps even beginning to see people the way Jesus saw people.

Something happens when we sit with one another without language, looking into each other's eyes without prejudice. What we see and experience is the purity of another human being – the *imago Dei* (image of God). We might say that in the mystery of such an encounter healing can occur. We might even say the kingdom of God draws near or is revealed.

How might we rethink our approach to building relationships and engaging others in light of Jesus' instructions and by the example of vulnerability seen in this experiment.

I believe that there is a profound principle at work in this story. It is a concept that should be true when we engage persons of different nationalities, cultures, and religious backgrounds. It should play out when we engage persons of different political points of view. It should play out when we engage with people who disagree with us on any number of social, political, and religious issues. This principle could change our method of discourse across all our lives and quiet the angry rhetoric and allow us all to think about what is right for everyone, not simply what is right for "me" and "my people."
