## The Band Is Out on the Field, and He's Gonna' Go into the Endzone!

In 1982 the University of California at Berkeley played a now legendary game of football against Stanford University. The Cal Bears were the underdogs against the Stanford Cardinal in this rivalry game. The game was close, but in the closing moments it looked like the Cardinal would be victorious. Stanford scored a touchdown with only seconds left on the clock, and prepared to kick-off to

the Bears for one last play before time ran out.

What happened next was utter mayhem. Stanford kicked the ball high in order to kill time on the clock and to get their defenders to the receiver before he could catch it. The Bears caught the ball, threw a lateral pass, then another lateral pass. The ball carrier then was caught by several defenders and tackled, but before they could get him to the ground he pitched the ball again to one of his teammates.

Here is where things get really crazy. The Stanford Cardinal marching band saw the tackle, but not the pitch. They thought the game was over, and so they all started running out onto the field to play the school song in victory. *But the play wasn't over*. The Bears still had the ball, and were charging down the field. "The band is out on the field, and he's gonna' go into the endzone!" screamed the announcer on the television broad cast.

The band were quite surprised to see football players charging at them full speed! The players were quite surprised to have to now deal with a flood of people out on the field while the play was still going. The Bears nimbly worked their way through the band, who probably prevented the Cardinal players from catching up, and scored a touchdown. After the ball-carrier crossed into the endzone, his momentum was stopped by one very unfortunate trombone player who was laid out flat!

The Bears won the game, and in the annals of football history this moment is referred to as "The Play." This is a great example of what you might call, "premature celebration." Sport is full of examples of people who very nearly tasted victory but lost in the final moments because they celebrated before the job was done. Our former Bishop Hayes once said it is important to run *through* the finish line, not just *to* it, lest you lose in the final moments.

I am sure many of you are feeling quite frustrated with the recent rise in COVID cases in our state. I am as well. My heart breaks for those who are getting sick. I'm frustrated with the division and politicization of public health issues. I am worried that I don't have the emotional stamina to persevere. I feel like the trombone player who got bodied by 200 pounds of college athlete!

But friends, there is still time on the clock. The game isn't over yet. Let's keep the band on the sidelines and set our sights on the endzone. Let's not run *to* the finish line, let's run *through* it. God equips those that he calls, and he has called everyone one of us to rise to the occasion. I remember the words of Mordecai to Esther when she was facing impossible odds: "Who knows? Maybe you were made queen for just such a time as this."

Maybe, brothers and sisters, it is for such a time as this that God has been preparing us to advance his Kingdom. With God's help, and reliance on each other, we can defy the odds and win the victory.


