In the 1992 movie *Wayne's World*, the main character (the titular "Wayne") is obsessed with a 1964 classic white Fender Stratocaster electric guitar. He approaches it in the shop and calls the guitar, "Excalibur!" For Wayne, this is the ultimate guitar; the ultimate tool for rock and roll.

One question that people often ask when they are beginning to learn to play the guitar is, "Does it matter what the guitar looks like?" In one sense the answer is, "No," because for the most part (with some exceptions) the shape of a solid-body electric guitar doesn't affect the sound at all. However, most guitar salespeople will tell you that it *does* matter, but not for the reason you might think. If you *love* the way your guitar looks, if you think that it looks cool, then you are going to be more likely to pick it up and play it more often. And that's a good thing! You want to have a guitar that you like the look of so that you will stick with it and remain passionate about playing it.

So while the look of a guitar doesn't change the sound much, it does change the way that we think about it. For Wayne, that '64 Stratocaster probably doesn't sound that much better than a lot of other guitars, but it was the guitar that he loved and wanted! "It will be mine," he deadpans into the camera. "Oh yes, it will be mine!"

The early Methodists applied this same trick of psychology to the development of their faith. We all know that prayer, confession, taking care of people in need, reading the scripture, fasting, and all the other "means of grace" are important things that Christians ought to do. The early Methodists knew that, too! Yet, like many of us, they had a hard time putting many of those things to practice in their life. So, much like the trick of getting a guitar you like the look of to make you play it more often, they developed tricks to help them in engage in the means of grace more often! In fact, they became quite "methodical" in their approach to their faith, which is how we got our name.

Do you want to read the Bible more? What's your method? What's your trick for engaging with the scripture more often? Do you want to pray more regularly? What's your method? What are you going to do to make that a reality? A 1964 classic white Fender Stratocaster doesn't do anyone much good if no one plays it, much the same way a Bible doesn't do anyone much good if no one reads it.

My encouragement to you this month, if you want to grow in your faith, is to develop a method in your life for doing so. Find a way to routinize seeking the mans of grace. Much like playing the guitar, you will only get better with practice!




We hope that you all had a great Fall Break. Join us


