An Ark to Carry Us Through the Storms

Since the early days of the Church, Christians have invoked of the image of Noah's Ark to describe the body of believers. This association was so prevalent, when Christians began building permanent buildings to use as churches, the imagery of the ark was the primary guide for church architecture. The earliest permanent church buildings were designed to look something like ships.


This held true throughout much of Christian history. The vaulted ceilings of gothic cathedrals were meant to imitate an inverted ship. This tradition continues to hold true in many Christian churches today, including our own sanctuary! If you walk into the sanctuary and look up, imagine that you are in Noah's Ark and looking down to the bottom of the ship. Do you see it?

This imagery is meant to tell us something about the Church. The Church is the Ark of God that carries us through the stormy seas of life. Just as Noah and his family were spared from judgment in the flood, God carries the family of God to safety by means of the Church. The Church sustains us in difficult times and delivers us to fair weather and beautiful shores.
