No People Are Uninteresting

When I was in college at the University of Tulsa, there was a professor of Russian literature and film named Yevgeny Yevtushenko. I don't think I appreciated at the time what an important figure he was. He was involved in politics in the Soviet Union during the time of perestroika and advocated for democratic reforms. He was most famous worldwide for his poetry. Of course, to me, he was just my friends' Russian lit professor!

It wasn't until after I graduated that I actually read some of his poetry. My favorite poem of his is called, People. In it, he says,

No people are uninteresting. Their fate is like the chronicle of planets. Nothing in them is not particular, as planet is dissimilar from planet.

He goes on:

In any man who dies there dies with him his first snow and kiss and fight.

It goes with him...

It's not people who die, but worlds.

Yevtushenko expresses in his poem that every person who has ever lived has had a complex and wonderful history, a story unique to them. The memories and experiences that make up a person are complex and, ultimately, unknowable. We may know something about another person, but the internal world of who they are is a mystery.

That is why, Yevtushenko says, when a person dies an entire secret world dies with them. One of the beautiful affirmations of the Christian faith is that all people are made in God's own image. We recognize that every single person has a life as meaningful and complex as our own. In the life of every person there is a spark, a reflection, of the divine. "No people are uninteresting..." I'm inclined to agree.

This means that we must treat all people with respect and honor. Even if we don't particularly like them. Especially if we don't particularly like them! We pray for our friends and enemies alike. We pray for those we know and for strangers. We pray because, we know, each person is of sacred worth. Every person is a secret world unto themselves. Every person we meet is someone Jesus believed is worth dying for.


United Women in Faith—Fall Brunch—Unit Meeting for Mission
